# CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE BUDGET MONITORING REPORT 2006/07 Report no. DCYP06050

Officers presented a report which provided an opportunity for the Children and Young People Portfolio Holder to review the latest projected variations on the 2006/07 revenue budget.

The Portfolio Holder noticed a projected under spend in Special Educational Needs. It was explained when the accounts were closed each year an estimate of the amount of payments (expenditure) outstanding relating to that, and prior, years was made and an appropriate provision was made in the accounts. When the 2005/06 accounts were closed an estimated provision of £2.9m was made relating to SEN outstanding payments; based on latest information the actual amount payable was likely to be £128,000 less. This amount would vary during the course of the year as actual invoices are received from other local authorities.

A similar estimate was made in relation to outstanding receipts (income). When the 2005/06 accounts were closed an estimated provision of £1.8m was made and, based on latest information, the amount receivable was likely to be £18,000 in excess of this.

The Portfolio Holder commended officers on the "pleasing position" on budget performance. He requested that in the next report on the budget he would like greater detail on the SEN under spend.

#### RESOLVED that the projected variations for 2006/07 be noted.
