3. COMMENTARY

3.1. Licensing Act 2003.

The Licensing Act 2003 states that any premises require a licence/certificate issued by the Council (premises licence/club premises certificate) where the following activities occur:-

Provision of regulated entertainment

- a) Plays. (Where the audience exceeds 500 people)
- b) Films.
- c) Indoor sporting events. (Where the audience exceeds 1000 people)
- d) Boxing or wrestling entertainment.
- e) Live music. (subject to the Live Music Act 2013 exemptions)
- f) Recorded music.
- g) Performances of dance. (Where the audience exceeds 500 people)

Provision of late night refreshment (between 2300hrs and 0500hrs).

Supply of alcohol (on and off sales).

The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

The sale by retail of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to a guest of a member of the club for consumption on the premises where the sale takes place.

Licences/Certificates may be issued subject to any terms, conditions or restrictions the Council feels are appropriate to address any or all of the four licensing objectives.

The Council has previously agreed Bromley's Statement of Licensing Policy for the Period 2016 – 2021.

The Licensing Sub-Committee must consider the Statement of Licensing Policy and any Special Policy of Cumulative Impact currently in force when making any decisions in respect of these applications.

Description of the Premises

The premise sits on the forecourt to Kent House Station and is a large detached double fronted premises. It has been in existence for approx. 6month and has operated as a coffee shop throughout. No previous licence has been in place for the premises. It currently has a pavement licence issued by the highways department to use the frontage for external consumption of food and drink (non-alcoholic). Its current opening hours are 0700hrs to 1800hrs

Licensing History

The premises have not been previously licenced under the Licensing Act 2003.

Details of the Application

This application is for a new premises licence for the Retail Sale of Alcohol 7 days a week as shown in appendix 1 (application form) are :

Mon and Tue 1200 to 1900

Wed to Fri 1200 to 2100

Sat and Sun 1200 to 1800

ON sales only

No seasonal Variation applied for.

Representations

During the public consultation period the Council received 12 representations against the application and 6 letters of Support. Copies of these are contained in appendix 2 and 3

4. IMPACT ON VULNERABLE ADULTS AND CHILDREN

- 4.1 Licensing regimes provide for additional controls through specific permissions to undertake activities. Both the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 contain licensing objectives which seek to protect particular vulnerable groups. In the case of the Licensing Act 2003 it seeks to protect children from harm whereas the licensing objectives under the Gambling Act 2005 are wider and seek to protect children and vulnerable adults from being harmed or exploited.
- 4.2 Businesses and the Council are required to promote these objectives in the way they operate or make decisions.
- 4.3 Details of applications under both Acts are referred to the appropriate safeguarding teams for comment.

5. POLICY IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 Both the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005 require the Council to prepare, consult on and publish statements of their licensing policy. These must be reviewed at least every 5 years under the Licensing Act and 3 years under the Gambling Act.
- 5.2 Members should make decisions in accordance with these policies but are free to depart from them with good reason.

6. FINANCIAL & LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 There are rights of appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee under both the Licensing and Gambling Acts. If an appeal were to be lodged there are costs associated with defending it. These are difficult to quantify and the Courts can award costs. In the event of a successful appeal we could pay the costs of the appellant as well as our own. Equally if we successfully defended an appeal, it is open to the Court to order our costs to be paid by the appellant.
- 6.2 Parties involved in a hearing before a Sub-Committee can also seek a Judicial Review if the Local Authority has failed to administer the hearing in accordance with proper procedures.
- 6.3 The Council has adopted a procedure for the conduct of hearings.

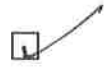

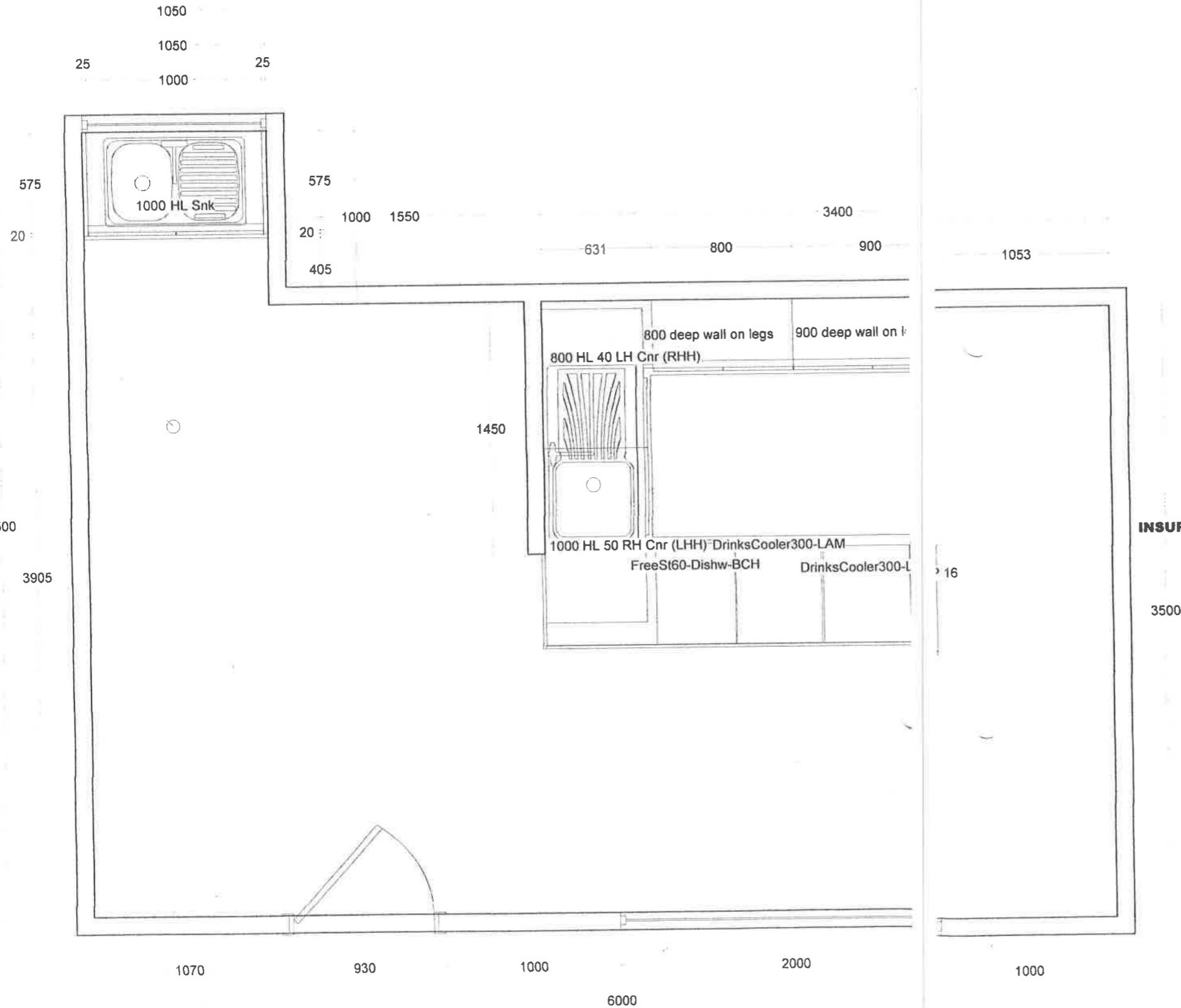

Dear Sir/Madam

Re: Application 18/00351/LAPRE

We are writing to express our opposition to the proposed licence. We are householders in Barnmead Road and our property abuts the rear of the Kent House Coffee & Flowers shop. As the application recognises this is a residential area. We had no objection to the opening of retail premises in such close proximity to our house. However, we believe that the sale of alcohol brings with it a completely different dimension.

The shop is directly beside Kent House Station. The station is used virtually constantly by school children both commuting and utilising the embankment tunnel. The proposed opening hours from 12.00 Monday to Sunday will bring school children into direct contact with the consumption of alcohol both during lunch time and on their way home. This cannot be avoided. This cannot be appropriate.

The same could be said of parents traversing this route with small children as they are taken to adjacent nurseries.

We appreciate the sentiment that good order would be maintained but both Barnmead Road and Plawsfield Road are not roads that are heavily policed either by foot or car patrols. Moreover, as the premises are tucked away to the side of the Station it is not even visible to passing patrols on Beckenham Road, which in itself is approximately 100m away. What level of staffing is proposed when so little immediate policing is available?

We have already stated the proximity of our property to the shop. Please bear in mind that there are a number of other residential properties equally as close. Unfortunately, we cannot believe that the consumption of alcohol will be undertaken in the same relaxed manner as drinking a coffee. Noise levels will undoubtedly rise. Is it realistic to expect all drinkers/smokers to refrain from going outside because that is what the application implies?

The station generates much foot traffic constantly and in surges at peak hours. All these people pass in close proximity to the shop. The premise is also close by the turning circle for drivers dropping off/picking up rail users. Public Safety would be an issue.

The nearest public house to the station is presently in Penge approximately 5 minutes away. Is there really the necessity for another licensed premises in such close proximity?

Non-resident parking in both Plawsfield and Barnmead Roads has been a problem historically. Limited parking restrictions are only imposed Monday to Friday until such time as the proposed alcohol sales commence. Is there not the possibility that the granting of a licence would see both an increase in traffic and consequential demand for parking?

We believe that our objections to the granting of a licence are valid. It is our considered opinion that an alcohol licence will change the dynamics of what is first and foremost a residential road. We hope our views are considered.

Noise not only from within the premises but from customers drinking outside on the public pavement and while arriving and leaving. Also noise generated when the cafe is closing up, removing their outside furniture from the pavements to store away and when receiving bottled deliveries. Additionally the cafe's disposal of bottles and bottle refuse waste collections.

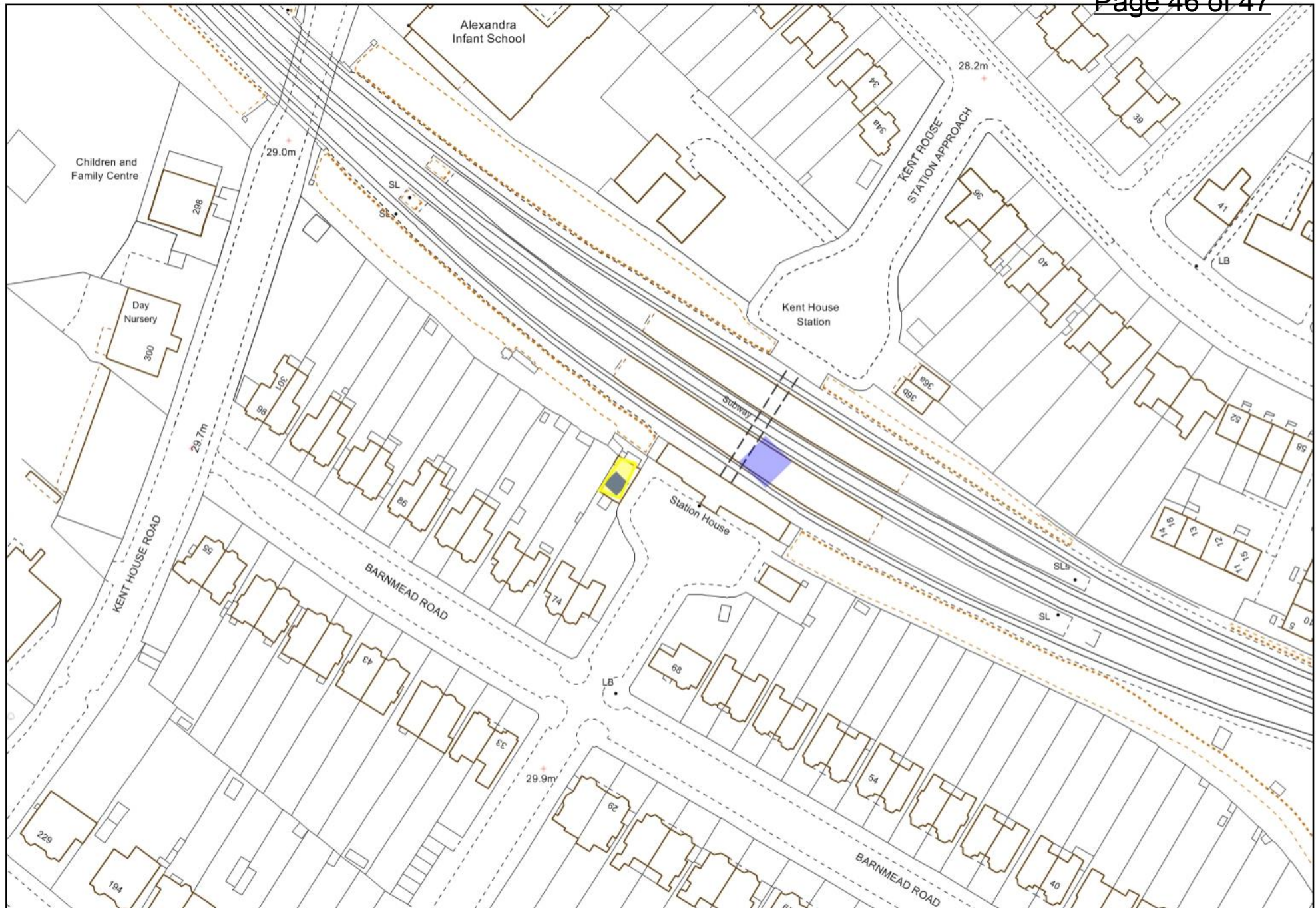
