# Consultation: Proposal to Permanently Expand Churchfields Primary School from 30 to 60 Pupils at Year Reception from September 2013

This letter outlines the case for the expansion of Churchfields Primary School and how you can respond to the consultation. **The deadline for responses is Friday, 20 July 2012.** Existing and prospective parents/carers are invited to attend a consultation meeting at the school on **Thursday, 12 July at 7pm**. The meeting is scheduled to last for one hour.

Following consultation in January 2010 on the proposed expansion of four Bromley Primary Schools; Bickley, Churchfields, Princes Plain and Unicorn Primary Schools, the Council took the decision not to permanently expand Churchfields Primary School and to review the decision in Spring 2012. Following this review, the Council has decided to consult on the proposal to increase the admission number for Churchfields Primary School from 30 to 60.

Bromley Council has a duty to ensure that there are sufficient school places available for all children. The Council must also ensure that the size, location, organisation and number of pupil places deliver best value in the use of public funding. The 2012 review of Bromley primary school places identified the need to increase the number of Reception places (i.e. at the age children start school) available to children at a number of schools across the Borough. You can access the relevant Report 'Review of Primary Schools' Development Plan: Outcomes' (reference DCYP12025) on Bromley Council's website (www.bromley.gov.uk). Alternatively, a hard copy is available to view in the school office.

## The proposal for Churchfields Primary is to permanently expand the school from 30 to 60 Pupils at Year Reception from September 2013.

We would welcome your views and comments on our proposal. Please find some statistical information attached at Appendix 1 which you may find helpful in considering Bromley Council's case for increasing places for children at Churchfields Primary School.

The outcomes from consultation will be reported to the Education Policy Development and Scrutiny Committee on 11 September 2012 – this is a public meeting which starts at 7pm. If approved, the increase in school places would be effective from September 2013.

This will be available to view on the Council's website a week before the meeting. Information provided in response to this consultation will be published in accordance with access to information regimes including the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

#### PLANNING AREA 1 - CHURCHFIELDS PRIMARY SCHOOL

**Proposal:** Expand the school from 1-Form of Entry (30 pupils) to 2-Forms of Entry (60 pupils) at Year Reception from September 2011.

**Profile**: For the purpose of planning pupil places, Bromley Borough is divided into nine Strategic Planning Areas – Alexandra Infant, Alexandra Junior, Balgowan Primary, Churchfields Primary, James Dixon Primary, Malcolm Primary, Royston Primary, St Anthony's RC Primary, St John's CE Primary and Stewart Fleming Primary Schools are all located in Planning Area 1.

Wards: Crystal Palace, Penge and Cator, Clock House.


Analysis: This continues to be a volatile area in pupil place planning terms. The numbers of 4 year olds in this area remains above that of the total admissions numbers for the schools. The analysis indicates a history of migration to schools in the neighbouring Planning Area 2 and a high percentage take up of primary places in two of the authorities which border this area, ie Croydon and Lewisham. This area is currently showing a projected shortfall of places of approximately two forms of entry. To meet the demand for additional places Churchfields Primary School accepted an additional 30 pupils for the 2010-11 and 2011-12 Reception admission rounds and Malcolm and Royston Primary Schools each accepted an additional 30 reception pupils in 2011-12. The current shortfall of places could increase if fewer places are available out-of-borough and if parents are unable to secure places in Planning Area 2.
