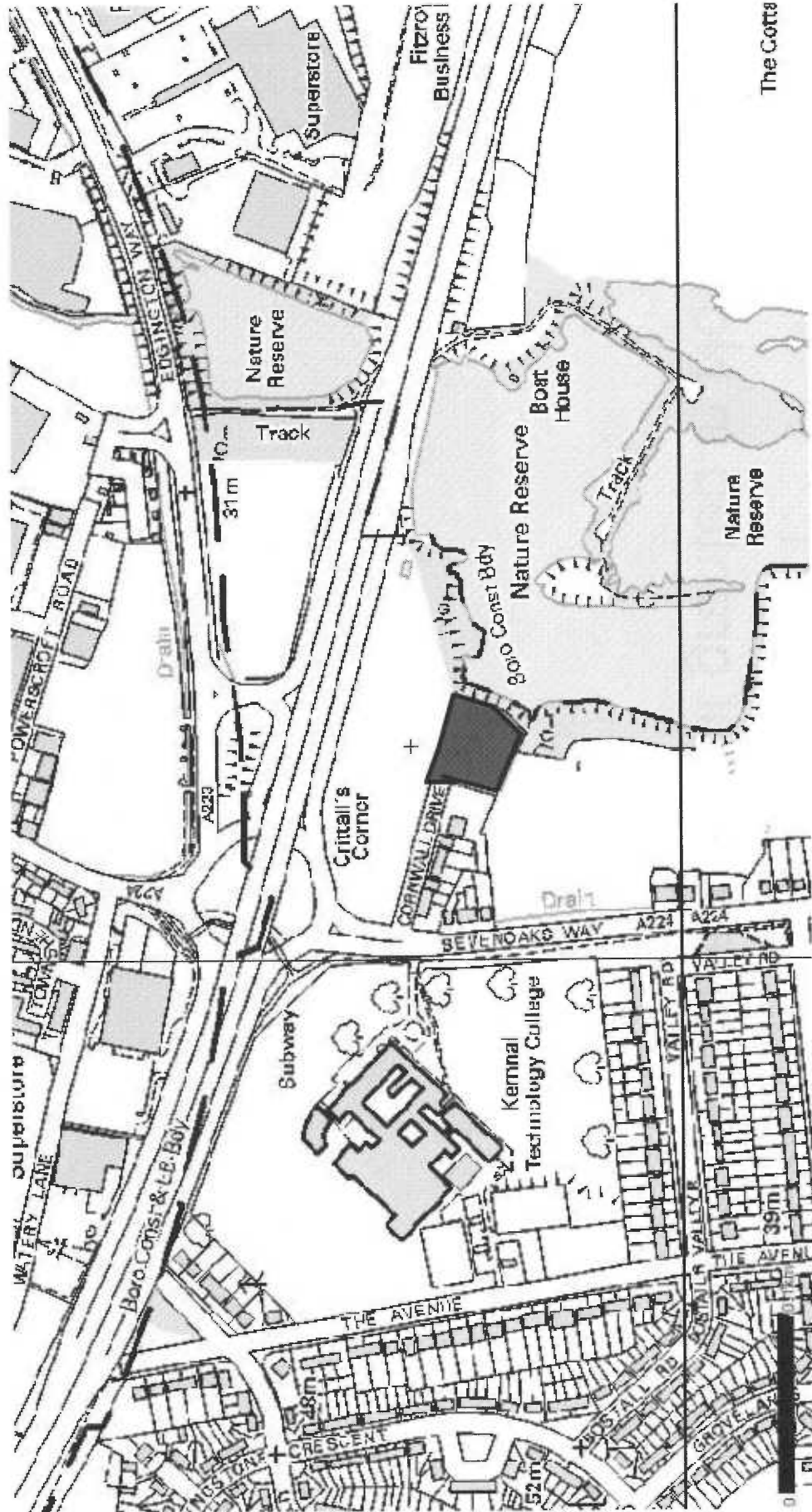


Cornwall Drive, Orpington

- ⇒ Revoked permit in September 2011.
- ⇒ Waste4Fuel Limited permit granted in November 2011
- ⇒ Refuse Derived Fuel for export



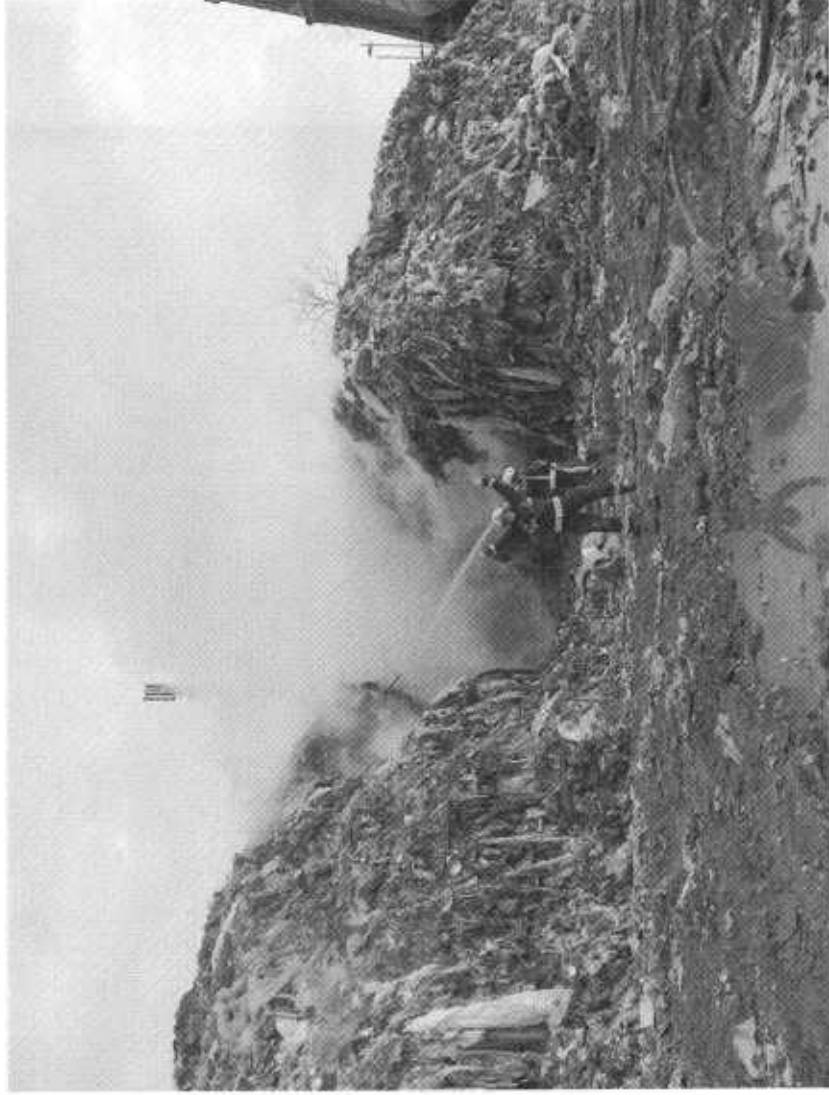
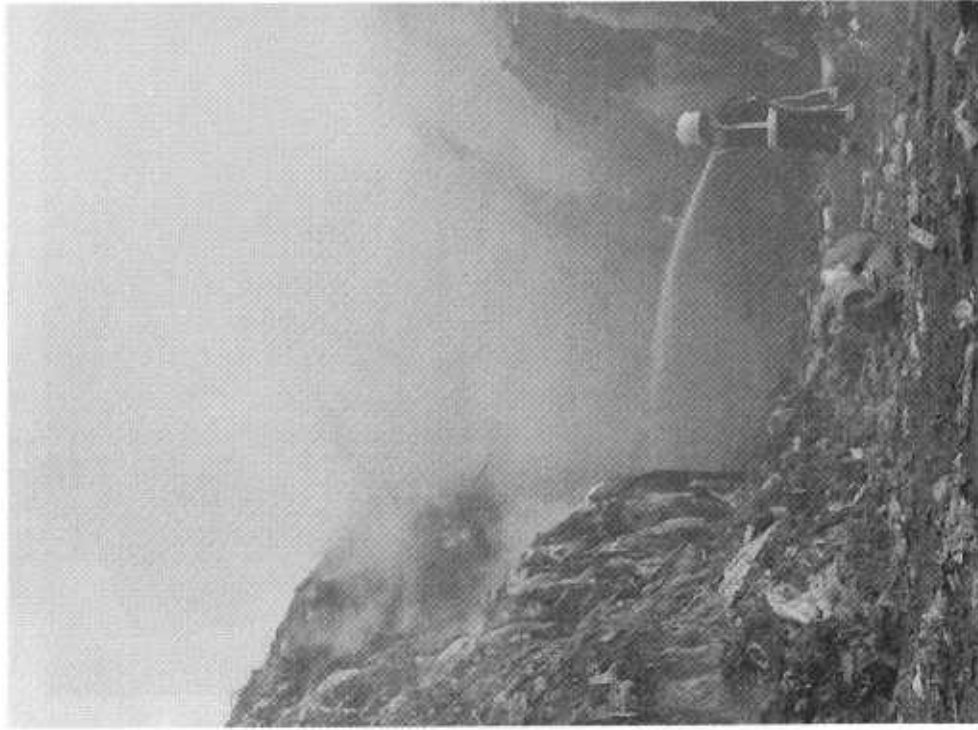
Operator Performance

- ⇒ 2011/2012: Band A performer
- ⇒ Jan - December 2012: Band F performer
 - ⇒ Significant concern regarding waste volumes
 - ⇒ Number of enforcement action including compliance notice
- ⇒ Early 2013: Fire Risk
 - ⇒ Concern grew regarding waste volume and fire risk
 - ⇒ Action plan agreed on 1st March 2013

EA Actions

- ➔ High Priority Site
 - ➔ Inspection frequency greatly increased
 - ➔ Large resource allocation
- ➔ Community Engagement
 - ➔ Spoke at residents group meeting – 13th May
 - ➔ Regular meetings with Cllrs
 - ➔ Regular MP engagement
- ➔ Partnership Working with LFB

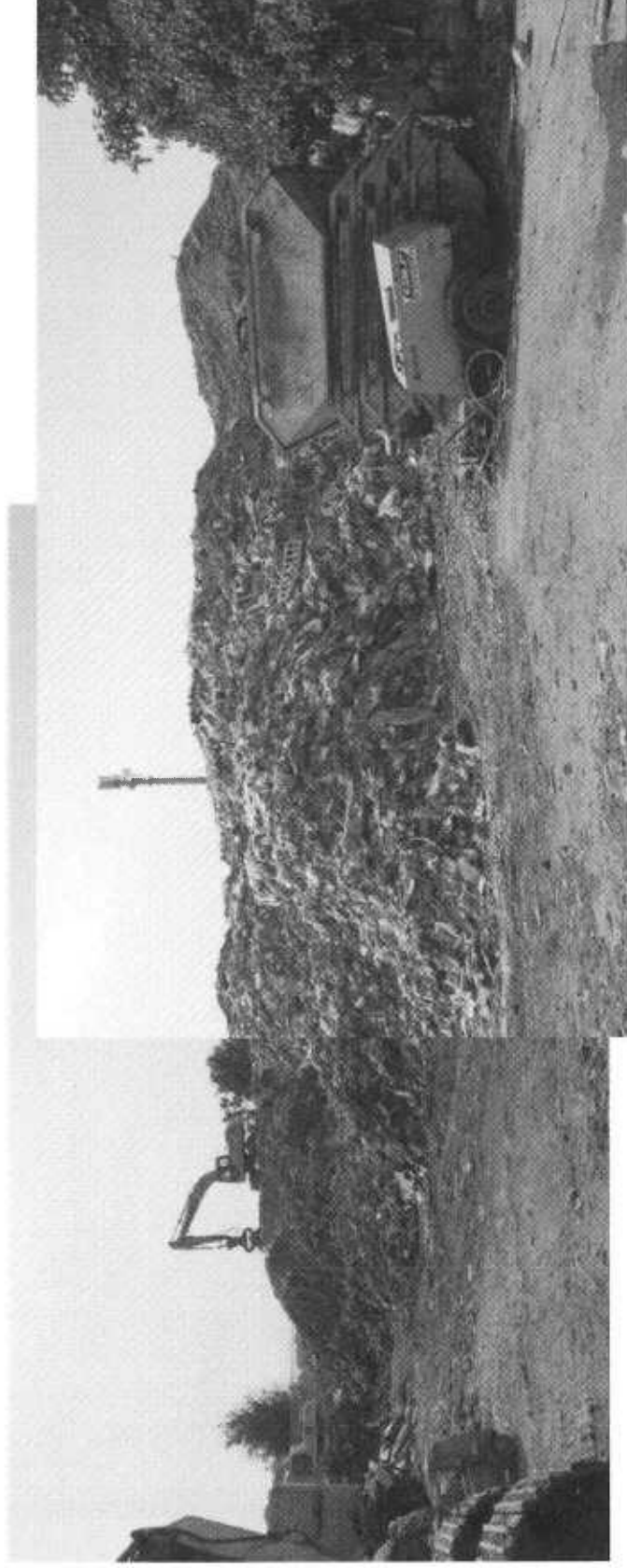
- ⇒ 22nd April 2013: Suspension Notice issued
 - ⇒ Limited activities to 200t waste in per week and a minimum of 600t out per week. Site to be cleared by combustible waste by June 2013.
 - ⇒ Maintain regulatory grip while ensuring reduction in fire risk and avoiding an orphaned waste site



➔ June 2013 – Waste levels slowly reducing



➔ July 2013: Behaviour change



- Waste volumes began to significantly increase
- Fire risk also increased
- Legal advice sought

⇒ August 2013: Application for an Order in the High Court

- ⇒ Highest level of action available to us
- ⇒ Order against company and director
- ⇒ Significance on non-compliance

⇒ 29th August 2013: Initial hearing resulted in interim order. Full hearing yet to take place

- ⇒ 3 deadlines:
 - 7th September – Fire break 1
 - 19th September – Shredded Waste
 - 30th September – Fire break 2

Benefits of this approach

- ➔ Order is also against director of company
- ➔ Significant penalty for non-compliance
- ➔ Likelihood of orphaned site reduced
- ➔ Fire risk is managed 24hrs a day
