3. COMMENTARY

- 3.1 General Purposes and Licensing Committee last reviewed the standard conditions relating to animal health and welfare licences at their meeting on 27 September 2010 (Report ES 10144).
- 3.2 Since then the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) have revised the model licence conditions for cat and dog boarding, pet vending and dog breeding.
- 3.3 These publications have been produced in partnership with many leading animal health and welfare groups.
- 3.4 The Council uses the veterinary service of the Corporation of London to assist in undertaking its licensing functions. They are asking that we adopt the revised conditions as they are the current standards and use them as the basis for their licensing inspections.
- 3.5 The revised licence conditions cover the following activities

Pet Animals Act 1951. Pet Shops selling animals require a licence. 10 premises are licensed in Bromley

Animal Boarding Establishment Act 1963. Boarding Kennels for cats and dogs must be licensed by the local council. 23 premises are licensed in Bromley.

Dog Breeding - Breeding & Sales of Dogs Acts 1973, 1991 and (Welfare) 1999. Anyone who breeds from a bitch / bitches and has 5 or more litters in a year requires a licence. 2 premises currently licensed in Bromley.

- 3.7 There have been no revisions to the standards for Riding Establishments or Dangerous Wild Animals so we will continue to use the conditions adopted in 2010.

4. POLICY AND LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The Council is the licensing authority for a range of animal welfare matters and uses standard conditions when granting and renewing licences. These were last reviewed in 2010. Revised conditions have been produced by the CIEH and these represent an agreed industry standard.
