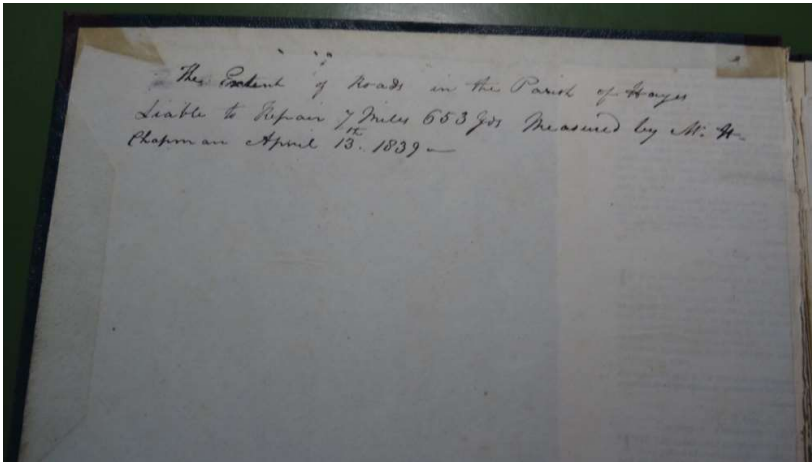

The supporter's comments about this document are:

The first document is a record of statute duty for highway maintenance for the Parish of Hayes. The first entry records lists works executed by contract and it details drawing 9 loads of flints from Miss Traills meadow to Hayes Street Farm. 1/4 mile.

Beneath it is written "drawing 2 loads of gravel from pit to the same place being 3/4 mile", and a summary of materials used. The extent of roads in the parish of Hayes in 1839 liable to repair is listed as 7 Miles, 653 Yards measured by Mr Chapman 13th April 1839

There are through route detailed references to all roads repaired in Hayes, and also to repairs to Hayes Street (which stops at Chatham Avenue), and to Hayes Lane, which passes in front of Hayes Street Farm. It would be unusual to include and detail the word "Farm" here unless the repairs were relating directly to Hayes Street Farm property and not the highways which are extensively repaired and accurately detailed also throughout this period. The occupants of Hayes street farm appears to be the highway surveyor at the time for the parish (See tithe)

There has been a gravel drive through Hayes Street Farm as far back as records show, it can be seen on Google Earth History.
