1.1 Following an approach from a local resident (who is the regional lead for <u>Young People's Gambling Harm Prevention Programme</u> at <u>GamCare</u>) offering free training to councillors on gambling related harm, Cllr Gabbert requested an information briefing for PDS on the issue.

Impact on Vulnerable Adults and Children

1. Summary of Impact: Children and young people are exposed to gambling activities and gambling-style features from a young age (television, football stadiums, online games). Gambling-style behaviours that are present when playing online games will be far more common with under 18s than the national data shows for more traditional forms of gambling. The Children's Commissioner has warned that monetisation is where online gaming starts to look less like 'play' and more like gambling.
