1. Reason for report

1.1 To provide the Licensing Sub-Committee with information supporting them to determine this licence application.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee asked to determine this application having taken into account the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2021 to 2026 and written and oral representations by the applicant and objectors.

3. COMMENTARY

3.1. Licensing Act 2003.

The Licensing Act 2003 states that any premises requires a licence/certificate issued by the Council (premises licence/club premises certificate) where the following activities occur:-

Provision of regulated entertainment

- a) Plays. (Where the audience exceeds 500 people)
- b) Films.
- c) Indoor sporting events. (Where the audience exceeds 1000 people)
- d) Boxing or wrestling entertainment.
- e) Live music. (subject to the Live Music Act 2013 exemptions)
- f) Recorded music.
- g) Performances of dance. (Where the audience exceeds 500 people)

Provision of late-night refreshment (between 2300hrs and 0500hrs).

Supply of alcohol (on and off sales).

The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club.

The sale by retail of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to a guest of a member of the club for consumption on the premises where the sale takes place.

Licences/Certificates may be issued subject to any terms, conditions or restrictions the Council feels are appropriate to address any or all of the four licensing objectives.

The Council has previously agreed Bromley's Statement of Licensing Policy for the Period 2021 – 2026.

The Licensing Sub-Committee must consider the Statement of Licensing Policy and any Special Policy of Cumulative Impact currently in force when making any decisions in respect of these applications.

Members' attention is drawn to the following parts of the policy which are relevant to this application.

Description of the Premises

The restaurant sits on the ground floor of a three storey building. There is a large private forecourt to the front of the premises. The upper 2 floors of the building are residential properties which are accessed through the covered forecourt.

Elmers End Road is a busy street with numerous business and residential properties in close proximity.

A satellite image and street view of the premises can be found in **Appendix 5**.

Licensing History

Whilst this is an application for a new premises licence, there is a current licence in force at the premises. The premises was previously a restaurant trading a 'SE Twenty'. The premises licence was transferred to Bella Vista Beckenham Ltd in June 2023.

A copy of the current licence can be found at **Appendix 2**.

Details of the Application

This is an application for a new premises licence for the sale of alcohol on the premises, to provide Late Night Refreshment, recorded and live music, performance of dance and similar activities as summarised in the table below.

Representations

4. IMPACT ON VULNERABLE ADULTS AND CHILDREN

- 4.1 Licensing regimes provide for additional controls through specific permissions to undertake activities. Both the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 contain licensing objectives which seek to protect particular vulnerable groups. In the case of the Licensing Act 2003 it seeks to protect children from harm whereas the licensing objectives under the Gambling Act 2005 are wider and seek to protect children and vulnerable adults from being harmed or exploited.
- 4.2 Businesses and the Council are required to promote these objectives in the way they operate or make decisions.
- 4.3 Details of applications under both Acts are referred to the appropriate safeguarding teams for comment. None were received in this instance.

5. TRANSFORMATION / POLICY IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 Both the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005 require the Council to prepare, consult on and publish statements of their licensing policy. These must be reviewed at least every 5 years under the Licensing Act and 3 years under the Gambling Act.
- 5.2 Members should make decisions in accordance with these polices but are free to depart from them with good reason.
- 5.3 The current polices are -
 - Statement of Licensing Policy 2021 2026
 - Statement of gambling policy 2022 2025

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 There are rights of Judicial Review and appeal to the Magistrates Court against the decision of the Sub-Committee under both the Licensing and Gambling Acts. If an appeal were to be lodged there are costs associated with defending it. These are difficult to quantify and the Courts can award costs. In the event of a successful appeal we could pay the costs of the appellant as well as our own. Equally if we successfully defended an appeal, it is open to the Court to order our costs to be paid by the appellant.

- 8.2 Any Party involved with the hearing before licensing subcommittee can appeal any decision made at that hearing to the magistrate's court.
- 8.3 The Council has adopted a procedure for the conduct of hearings.



 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).



3. Free Potable Water

(1). The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4. Age Verification:

- (1). The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2). The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3). The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

5. Minimum Measures:

- (1). The responsible person must ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—.
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; .
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and .
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; .
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

6. Permitted Price:

- (1). A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2). For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -



P = D + (D X V)

where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

7. Films:



I am emailing you regarding the restaurant Bella vista located 85-89 Elmer's end road Beckenham br34sy.

I am emailing to oppose this application For the alcohol and opening times for the following reasons of the relevant representations

FIRSTLY The protection of children from harm:

The prevention of public nuisance/ public safety:

XXX ... we would never get a break from the constant noise of people being loud and drunk and this which could lead to people being aggressive and this is making me very worried for myself and my children I will not feel safe in my own home! ...**XXX** this is only going to heighten it.

XXX ...I am apposing all the application

With this application of the sale by retail of alcohol 09:00 to 2400 hours, the provision of regulated entertainment 09:00 to 23:00 hours and the provision of late night refreshment 23:00 to 24:00 hours

xxxx! Also this will affect my sons daily and night routine he will have interrupted sleep. This is not acceptable

XXX...

Objection 02:

I am writing in regards to a new business that is being set up on the ground floor of a block of flats at 85-89 Elmers End Road - BR3 4SY in Beckenham. Residents of the flats above these premises have been informed by a letter that has been put up outside the restaurant premises that this new Italian restaurant intends to remain open while selling alcoholic refreshments until midnight and providing live entertainment whether it's playing music as well as having live bands playing until 23.30pm.

I am getting in touch to express my concerns and to object to these opening times and conditions for the following reasons:

This restaurant is located on the ground floor in a block of flats where young families with very young children live. The entrance to my flat is through their premises. Not only is it a huge inconvenience having to walk through their terrace full of customers sat at the tables in order to access my own flat but also the noise that the service they offer, their customers, staff and their music will cause but also the wellbeing and safety of residents living in these flats will be compromised.... especially if they intend to sell alcohol until late hours of the day.

I am strongly objecting to their very long opening times, the entertainment and the selling of alcohol until midnight in order to:

- Prevent crime and disorder in our quiet neighbourhood
- Maintain and protect public safety
- Prevent public nuisance
- Protect children from harm

Furthermore, I would like to add that there is a history of ongoing dispute between local residents and the owner of the previous business which run for a few years in these same premises whereby we had to even record noise through an online App to report public nuisance as requested by Bromley Council. We would like to prevent a similar battle again with the new owner of the new business for the exact same reasons, above explained.

The previous business run until 9.30pm and we already suffered with the noise levels, were unable to sleep or even spend time in our living rooms without being hugely disturbed by loud chatter, laughter, hear chairs being dragged against the ground and the music.

This is a very quiet area and residents in the flats above these premises are all workers who have early nights in order to get up early for work in the morning. Please, I would like your department/team to strongly consider the devastating impact that granting a license to this business for such late hours of business would have on residents on this road.

In addition, I would like to request for an assessment on noise levels with noise limiter fitted to be carried out in the premises to ensure that any played and live music will not disturb residents during their opening times.

I am aware that other residents have already objected to these conditions and I would like to support this cause given the consequences that this will bring.

Please, I would like further advice on this matter regarding next steps and I would like to request clarification on the intended opening day. I have heard they are planning to open on 20th August even though the deadline that residents have to object is 4th September as per the attached letter.

Objection 03: Witham Road

Whilst it will be lovely to have a local spot for lunches and coffees, I do not deem it necessary for the business to be open so late.

Using the current example of 'The Graces' which is situated just next to this, we have Saturday night chaos with drunken local tradesmen every week, often I must cross the road if I'm out walking the dog late due to their drunken behaviour.

If serving alcohol this late in a poorer area such as Anerley, the noise levels will be extremely

high and affect the quality of sleep from those such as my elderly parents. The neighbourhood will be even less safe at the later hours due to the increased number of drunken customers. If music is playing, this will also affect locals. The building is made from glass/sheet plastic and the noise will not be contented to an inside building.

It's also right next to a main road, and if serving so late I believe you must consider the safety of vulnerable poor working class people who will be led to this venue for the alcohol consumption.

I worry therefore that due to the nature of the local community, it will be overrun with what I know already to be a high volume of 'gang like' cultures and therefore making the streets unsafe for young women and vulnerable elderly residents.

I'd love a new spot in the area to visit, but I feel alcohol should be licensed only until 10, or this restaurant has become a dangerous bar.

Objection 04: Ravenscroft Road

Living close to the premises and having experienced the noise and Ness caused by the previous occupants SE20 when drinkers left and name lots of noise or hung around nearby, I object you a late licence application. I cannot see diners still drinking at midnight and if they are, by the time they depart it is much later, so essentially disturbing the residents who all live by the premises. This was awful when SE20 were there and drink people left rubbish in the road, hung around shouting and using the street as a toilet. 11pm is fine, as this is usual, bit I think it is unnecessary to have a late night licence in this quiet residential area. I strongly object as I do not want to have disturbed sleep and police coming when there is a repeat of the issues that were caused by SE20 diners and drinkers. The restaurant already posted fake reviews on sites stating food and service great, good prices etc and they have not even opened. It was only as residents then postedx1 star reviews and advised jot even open that they removed this, so there is already distrust towards this establishment and it is worrying that they now wish to have a late night licence. As far as I am aware, they gave not put up signs advising this either.

Following on from a consultation with Police last week it has been agreed that the venues hours of operation shall be:

Mon – Thurs & Sun from 0900hrs – 2300hrs Fri & Sat from 0900hrs – 0000hrs

With the Sale and supply of alcohol from:

Mon – Thurs & Sun from 0900hrs – 2230hrs Fri & Sat from 0900hrs – 2330hrs

With the following conditions: -

- The Premises has an approved CCTV system which is regularly maintained by NSI – Nacoss Gold Standard/SSAIB registered installer subject to a maintenance contract. The system will always be fully operational, as stipulated/recommended by the installer.
- 2. The system will be in use and recording at all times during licensed hours and whilst people are on the premises. It is able to record in all lighting conditions and images recorded are of good, evidential quality. A member of staff will be available at all times to operate the system and supply copies of the recordings on request to either a Police, Council or other authorised officer. The recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days.
- 3. An incident log (which may be electronically recorded) shall be kept at the premises by the organiser and made available on request to police or an authorised officer. The following details shall be recorded:

Date of incident
Time of incident
Location of incident
Persons concerned
Summary of incident
Identification of any Emergency Services Personnel who attended

- 4. Ensure that a refusals record is maintained at the premises and that such a record shall be made immediately available for inspection by the Police or an authorised Officer of the Local Authority.
- 5. A Challenge 25 initiative must be in operation to ensure that any person attempting to purchase alcohol who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that they are over 18 years of age. Proof of age shall

- only comprise a valid and in date passport, photo card driving licence, military card or a card bearing the PASS hologram.
- 6. Ensure that Challenge 25 posters/stickers are displayed and visible inside the venue.
- 7. Where the premises is being used for a pre-booked event/function/Celebration, or there are large numbers of persons anticipated in attendance at the venue then a risk assessment will be carried out by the management prior to the commencement date. If deemed necessary, the management will put in place measures to negate any risk. Considerations to include, but not limited to; SIA Security, appropriate number of staff, the use of polycarbonate glasses for all drinks, control of maximum capacity and implementing an entry/dispersal policy.
- 8. All bar staff will be trained in the Licensing Act 2003 and 'Challenge 25'. The training will be refreshed every 6 months and all staff training records should be maintained and kept on site. A designated member of staff should be able to produce the records on the request of police or other authorised person.
- 9. Alcohol to be sold/supplied ancillary to a meal with table service only, with the exception where patrons can order a drink at the bar whilst waiting to be seated & limited seating at the bar area to a maximum of 15 persons.
- 10. Outside/Garden/Smoking areas to close approximately 1hr prior to venues agreed closing hours; Mon Thurs & Sun @ 2200hrs and 2300hrs Fri & Sat.
- 11. All doors and windows are to be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place.
- 12. Signs will be displayed asking patrons to leave quietly when leaving the premises and to have consideration for the local community
- 13. Signs shall be displayed in the designated smoking area requesting that the public should be quiet reminding customers of the proximity of residential properties.
