The Portfolio Holder said that she would look into this.</p>	<p>MOPAC grant monies cannot be ringfenced for specific areas of work such as projects relating to drugs. However, we do work with MOPAC annually to agree what the monies are spent on, based on the Safer Bromley Partnership Strategy's priorities and local annual crime data, together with wider local and regional priorities for the benefit of Bromley's residents and businesses. The SBP also works closely with the priorities set out by the Combatting Drugs and Alcohol Partnership (CDAP) hence preventative and supportive projects relating to drug and alcohol supply, and use will always be considered when prioritising the MOPAC Grant.'</p>
